What is the TOS?

The Theosophical Order of Service (TOS) is a world-wide organisation based on recognition of the unity of all life and aimed at reducing suffering and injustice at all levels—human, animal and environmental.

The TOS was founded 1908 by Dr. Annie Besant, then International President of the Theosophical Society, to provide an opportunity for participation in activities which promote the first Object of the Theosophical Society: "to form a nucleus of the Universal Brotherhood of Humanity, without distinction of race, creed, sex, caste or colour."

The TOS is a separate organization from the Theosophical Society but is closely linked with it. Study, meditation and service are the three components of theosophical living. The TOS provides a framework in which theosophical principles can be applied in daily life and to issues of contemporary concern.

The distinctive, two-fold purpose of the TOS is selfless service to the needy and suffering and the inner transformation of the server that this requires. Dr. Besant summarised the mission of the TOS in its motto: A union of all who love in the service of all that suffers

Today there are many active TOS groups around the world, united in their ideal of selfless service.

TOS is a non-profit organization whose members are its greatest resource. They work as unpaid volunteers and donations are used for service projects, not for administration

REPORT OF NATIONAL DIRECTOR

2024-2025

K. Sivaprasad

National executive committee meeting was held at HQ hall, Adyar on 1-1-2025 to review the policy matters, programmes carried out and the approvals of financial matters. National committee members suggested based on the Director's report covering events and activities of the groups from different regions and at National level. On 3-1-25 the approvals of the Executive Committee was shared with the TOS members in the Annual General body Meeting at the HQ hall Adyar. Concern of dormant regions/groups remain as challenging issue and it was discussed to take initiatives for revival to render service activities in the places where TOS activities are not active. Women empowerment and livelihood activities for the deserving communities continue as priority for interventions. Dr. Revathy, Secretary, Chennai region from Adyar was nominated as new addition to National Executive committee as member. Br. Umakanth Rao expressed his inability to continue as EC member keeping in view on the health grounds. National Director expressed sincere thanks for the dedicated services rendered by Br. Umakanth Rao for many years with his valuable suggestions.

On 7th and 8th June 2025 Annual National TOS conference was organised at Adyar with participation of 65 members from all over the country. The theme of conference was Altruistic Service. In this event interactive sessions were held in groups on Love and kindness, Selflessness and Courage and Tolerance and Cooperation. Important topics covered include how Theosophical Society as a support to the Theosophical Order of Service and how Theosophical Order of Service as a support to Theosophical Society. Other short talks by speakers were on selected aspects of altruistic services. Activity reports presented by different regions were very interesting and learning for all participants. It was good experience sharing among groups to know from each other's innovative approaches in implementing service activities. Cultural programme by young talented artists was good entertainment to the participants. Br. Nalli Kuppaswami Chetty, Industrialist and Philanthropist was honoured as chief guest on this occasion and he is also very senior member of Chennai TOS group from a long time. We were glad that we could honour such a great philanthropist who received Padma Shri award in 2003 and Padma Bhushan award in 2025 from Government of India. He is closely associated with several Cultural and Music organisations in Chennai.

During this year two new TOS groups were formed, one is Panchamrutham group in Uttarakhand and another Motihari group in Bihar. This year 26 Life and 19 Patron members enrolled as new members.

K.sivaprasad ,National Director attended Theosophy World Congress in Canada, 23-29,2025 as a sponsored member by Indian Section and gave the presentation of Indian group activities at the TOS world conference .He Visited American retreat centre Krotona Institute of Theosophy from 2- 10 Nov. 2024 and visited J.Krishnamoorthy School at Ojai,California.From 11- 16 Nov.attended European School of Theosophy History Conference and Gate way to Mystical Consciousness at Ascona,Switzerland and gave talk on Theosophy and Biodiversity.

Odisha TOS convened 12th Regional conference on 19th Sep.2025. The theme of event was Sympathy and Compassion to build bridges and not walls.Honourable Governor of Odisha State Hon.Dr.Hari Babu Kambhampati was the Chief Guest and Chief Speaker was National Director.In her message Dr.Deepa Padhi, International Vice President of Theosophical Society emphasized that in the present world increasingly marked by divisions-of-race,religion,ideology and wealth-our responsibility as Theosophists and selfless service practitioners is to be the instruments of healing,understanding and Unity.Compassion is heart beat of service and empathy is language of soul.Together they dissolve barriers and open doors to peaceful understanding,mutual respect and collective well-being.Theosophy reminds us that behind all apparent separateness lies fundamental oneness that humanity is one family and life is sacred in all its forms.The TOS through its selfless initiatives,continues to practise these truths,turning philosophy of theosophy into action and ideals in to results. The groups of Zeera,Mahodadhi,Cuttack,Mahabharat,Kaligali,Barabati and Maa Bhubasini are actively involved in Service activities.Odisha is successful in mobilising CSR funds from Infovision and L&T and also running the sambedana trust with a shop generating funds for charity work.



For educating the children, we hired teachers to educate the marginalized section or drop out children. Education is important, but that is only encouraged when the marginalized section children is satisfied with the hunger, so to full the ir appetite we provide midday meals. We also help the children in chilly days by providing warm clothes.

Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 2025.

The Governing body takes pleasure in presenting the 38th Annual Report and Audited Statement of Accounts of TOS in Karnataka for the year ended 31.03.2025.

Membership :

The TOS in Karnataka has 152 Patron members and 1692 Life members during the year.

Funds :

The Capital Fund which was Rs.19,73,706 at the beginning of the year stood at

Rs.18,65,196 at the end of the year with the application for the year in excess of income. The balance of Endowment Fund stood at Rs.19,17,115 and Life Membership Fund was Rs.2,86,146. With declining interest rate and reduced donations it is important that Funds have to be raised to ensure substantial, meaningful and long term work of the TOS in Karnataka.

Income and Expenditure :

With the revival of TOS activities after COVID, donations received has increased and our work in the field of Education and Medical aid has expanded.

Important Activities

Activities during the past year have significantly increased and the focus has been mainly on Education Aid and Scholarships.

TOS, Karnataka, is registered under section 12A and 80G certification under Income Tax Act. Donations to TOS Karnataka are eligible for deductions to the donors in their personal Income Tax. All members are encouraged to donate generously and take this benefit. We also request you to spread this information to others so that donations received would encourage TOS Karnataka to conduct more activities.

The Annual General Meeting of the TOS, Karnataka Region will be conducted at Kaiwara, on Sunday, 14th September, 2025 during one of the days of KTF Annual Conference. This gathering would be very beneficial as

large number of TS members from across the state who are also TOS members gather for KTF conference, thereby encouraging discussions among members on how to increase membership, reorganize and revive local units, starting new units, prioritizing activities that would result in greater benefit to the local community, etc.

Preparation for next year's work / Future work and Priorities :

It is important to start planning for TOS work well in advance, some times a few months or even a year in advance. Some of the advantages of preparing in advance are, the objective becomes achievable, the projects taken up can be studied in detail and also obtain feedback from field experts, it can be made more practical, need based and useful thereby giving real benefit to the receiver of our aid and starting early also gives us time to contact donors and collect the required financial support.

The following are some of the activities conducted during the past one year:

Interest on Fixed Deposits kept with Karnataka TOS transferred to TOS units: Fixed Deposits are kept by TOS units with Karnataka Region and annually interest earned on these deposits is transferred to these TOS units for application in their charitable activities locally. Where interest on Fixed Deposits were requested, it was transferred to the respective TOS units. The local units have used these funds in addition to the funds collected by them to continue their good work.

Education Aid :

Educating a child is probably the best long term investment of the Society in general. Education helps a person to be self supporting and independent. TOS units across Karnataka have realized the greater benefit in supporting and promoting education and hence have channelized their effort and resources promoting activities in this direction.

Annie Besant Birthday:

On 1st October fruits were distributed to patients at government Hospital at Vijaynagar.

KANAKAPURA

About 500 Note books and Sports equipment to support Taluk level sports program were handed over to Grama Swarajya High School, Inora Gollahalli, Kanakapura Taluk located at the border of Karnataka with a strength of about 225 students. We have been actively involved and supporting this school in various ways for the past Twelve years.

TOS, Davanagere

Long note books Geometry boxes, Pens, Pencils, etc., were distributed to students of Primary, Middle School and High School students of various schools by the members of the Dvanagere unit in addition to their other on going activities. A full set of exercise equipment which helps in improving motor skills of handicapped children was handed over to TOS, Tumkur unit last year. This also included reading materials with pictures to help them to improve upon their faculties. Dr. Yoginder Singh, a Physiotherapist at the local Government Medical College takes Physiotherapy sessions and guides these children and their parents in using the equipment and performing exercises. The number of children taking benefit of this facility has now increased to 35 children from the initial 10 children at the beginning.

TOS, Bangarpete

School bags and Note books were distributed to rural Government school. In October Annie Besant birthday was celebrated with about 30 students giving a talk on her Life History. All the students were presented with participation certificates and the top 3 presenters were given momentos.

TOS, Mysore

The interest on deposit was transferred to Mysore unit and was fully utilised to purchase and distribute education aid kits consisting of note books, pencil boxes, geometry boxes, bags, etc to School children.

Sanmarga TOS, Huliya

Long and short Note books were distributed to needy school children. Applications for Scholarship have also been considered.

TOS, Chalkere

Apart from giving Note books, Scholarships were also presented. Sewing machine was gifted to a widow for supporting herself and her family by running a small tailoring shop.

TOS, Gauribidanur

Long note books and Scholarships were presented to students of government schools. Aquaguard water filter with 50LPH capacity along with supporting electric motor pump and water tank was installed at Government school, Kadbur.

TOS, Jayasuvarnapura

Student note books, exam writing pads were distributed to deserving school children during the annual Lodge programs.

TOS Chintamani

Government school at Battlahalli requested for Mic system for their daily assembly prayers, sports and cultural programs, etc., along with Note Books and Geometry box. All their requests were fulfilled by us.

Srinivasapura Taluk

This year also, Co-ordinating with local members of TOS in Srinivasapura Taluk of Kolar District, 9 Government schools were identified.

These Government schools were approached to identify their requirements for education aid. After discussions with school administration the following were considered as most important and were provided by us. Long Note books – 1,000 nos., Geometry box – 500 nos. and Exam writing pads – 500 nos. for high school and middle school students We are working to increase our activities across Karnataka in the following years. We would like to support TOS units across Karnataka in their local projects. Let us work together to make the fruits of our effort reach the needy and deserving.

We are thankful to our Auditors M/s.K.Ravi and Associates for auditing our accounts, preparing Balance sheet, filing tax returns and following up with other tax matters.

We are thankful to all the Office bearers, Committee members and members of the TOS, Karnataka Region for their full hearted support and active involvement in the successful functioning of the TOS work in Karnataka.

Annual Report - TOS Kerala Region 2024-25

In reflection upon the past year, 2024-25 served as a pivotal period for laying the foundation for future service endeavors. Throughout the diverse TS lodges in Kerala, we boast a considerable number of life members and patrons. However, the visibility of our service activities in the public domain has been somewhat limited, a factor among many being the wish of many of our members not seeking publicity for their service.

Mahatma Gandhi Charitable Trust for Education (MGCTE), a charitable society established over a decade ago, has been managing a primary school called SUN SCHOOL, at Kavalam, in Kuttanadu taluk of Alappuzha district, Kerala. The KG section of the school was redone in 2019 with grant support of Rs 1 lakh from TOS, and the renovated hall was christened as "Dr. Annie Besant" hall. MGCTE works with the objective of promoting Gandhian philosophy and is engaged in social service to the downtrodden. A Committee under TOS was constituted in 2019 which engages in social service activities. The school provides education to the children of poor farmers and farm workers of Kuttanadu taluk. Majority of its students are girls and those who belongs to the backward communities. Besides academic coaching, the school has been conducting skill training in various vilage products and servics like soap, paper bag, LED bulbs, tailoring, clock repairing, etc.. Since the village has been facing acute shortage of drinking water in the absence of potable water supply, the Society has last year installed a RO water plant at the school complex with the support of Rotary Club of Alleppey East, which is being extensively used by rhe villagers for their daily consumption.

During key gatherings, such as the TS Kerala meetings, President Madhusoodan Pillai and I, as Secretary A. Sivasubramanian, appealed to all groups within TOS to proactively organize at least one or two socially committed service activities annually. Our vision was to showcase these initiatives to the TOS Kerala group, simultaneously garnering public attention for the broader messages of TS. Taking up this call, TOS Kerala initiated impactful projects, including Anti-Addictions Gallery, Traffic Rules Gallery, Legal Literacy Gallery, Economics and Life Science Gallery and Health and Motivational Galleries in select schools across Kerala. As we look ahead to the next year, TOS Kerala is committed to expanding its service activities, with a special emphasis on initiatives involving children. Most recently, our Anti Addictions and Traffic Rules gallery were newly installed in schools (numbering a total of 12 schools) in the following

districts: 1. Trivandrum 2. Kollam 3. Ernakulam 4. Thrissur 5. Alleppey We are actively working to bring the aforementioned galleries to 100 Schools across Kerala by 2030. TOS Kerala in association with TOS Annapoorni Lodge Unit Alleppey Donated a total of Rs 25000 for 10 Kidney Patients in Alleppey Town, and we hope to continue the same as a biannual event. A total of Rs 30000 was donated to the to the Landslide victims in Wayanad by TOS National Unit on 15th of November, 2025 by the national TS President Br Pradeep Gohil. In the spirit of fostering a greater impact, TOS Kerala extends a heartfelt invitation to all TOS groups in Kerala to actively support service activities for deserving individuals. We recognize that financial support can be a crucial factor, and TOS Kerala is ready to provide guidance and offer modest financial assistance where needed. Thank you for your continued support.

Membership

At the end of the year our membership stood at 239 with 24 Patron Members, 205 Life Members and 10 General Members. Four of our General Members became Life Members. Three of our Patron Members, three of our Life Members and one General Member progressed from the physical to the higher realms.

We welcome in our midst our new Life Member, Sis. Rita Maru and our new General Member Bro. Sudesh Kumar who joined us during the year.

Educational Sponsorship Project

To encourage children from an underprivileged background to pursue formal education, our Sponsorship Project disburses financial assistance twice a year. The sum of Rs 5,000 or more received from our committed sponsors is distributed to nearly 400 students varying in age from 4 to 21 years. This aid which may appear to be but a paltry amount is truly valued by these families for whom any additional support is a blessing. Students on our waiting list far outnumber the available sponsors. Hence we are always on the lookout for additional sponsors.

Notebooks, pens and biscuit packets, gifted by our generous members as also the Bombay Theosophical Federation through their Jamubhai and Surya Dani Fund, were additionally distributed to our sponsored children.

In Freny's Footsteps

The mainstay of our Sponsorship project and the administrative anchor for TOS – Mumbai Region for the last several decades, Sis. Freny Toddywalla progressed to the Higher Planes on October 21, 2024. A founder member of TOS – Mumbai Region, over the years she had rendered remarkable contribution as President, Vice President, Secretary and Sponsorship Administrator, always ensuring that service was rendered silently and graciously. At the Commemoration meeting “In Freny’s Footsteps” we had convened in her honour on December 1, 2024, several speakers valued her warmth, genial nature, kindness and dedication to the cause of Theosophy.

Colloquium - Educational Training Camp

Among the important Resolutions adopted in the said AGM the following two may be noted:

- a) All the remaining Theosophical Society members in different lodges under the Bengal Theosophical Federation would become life members of the TOS during the coming year.
- b) In due deference to the laudable proposal earlier made by Bro Satrajit Chakraborty, it has been decided that daily donation of one rupee from each TOS member would be collected for TOS activities in the region. The total annual contribution of Rupees 365/366 would be collected in maximum 3 installments under due receipt.

2) TOS activities executed during the year :

280 school t'shirts (uniforms) were distributed to Bharat Sevasram Sangha school students at Bolpur (Shantiniketan) during National Conference in February 2025, with a contribution of Rs. 28000/- from the TOS, Bengal. The remaining cost was borne by the School.

3) Fund received from the National Section :

We received a total amount of Rs. 18984/- in March, 2025. The rest of the expenditure was met out of our balance credit in the TOS bank account.

4) Proposed activities for the next year :

- 1) 41 Tarpaulin sheets are to be distributed to the rain-and- flood affected families in the remote 24 Parganas (South) district under Kultali P.S. and Laxmikantapur P.S. in The cost of the event is estimated about Rs. 21000/- in October, 2025.
- 2) A weekly homeopathic clinic for the poor patients will be run from the hqrs of the TOS at BTS , Kolkata from December,2025. It is going to run under Dr.Sis Jayasri Das, a duly qualified Homeopath, with assistance from one/two TOS members. This free treatment will be supported by free medicines as far as possible. Annual expenses for the free clinic is estimated at 5000/- a month, with a total of Rs. 60000/- per annum.
- 3) Kolkata is a heritage city with a few thousand rickshaw-pullers still engaged in pulling manual rickshaw. They generally hail from Bihar and other adjacent areas. We would undertake to select 50 such needy rickshaw pullers to provide with a vest, a lungi, an underwear and a napkin for each of them. Expected cost for the programme is about RS.25000/-
- 4) Nimpeeth TOS group is going to organise a winter distribution of dress/blanket for 50 indigent families of this remote area. The estimated expenditure is about RS/- 20000/-.
- 5) In the Jhargram district (Jangalmahal) of tribal dalit people, an event for distribution of winter clothes to only about 100/- people would be undertaken during winter months. The expenses may go up to Rs.40000/- for the purpose.
- 6) There is a primary school near Eastern Metropolitan Bypass which needs some electric fans during the very hot months of summer. We would like to provide them 8/10 fans for the school at about an expenditure of RS. 40000/-.

Logistic support, including transport and conveyance etc. to the tune of Rs. 14000/- will be required to execute the projects as detailed above.

Thus, in all, we need a fund amounting to 2,20,000/-(Rupees two lakh twenty thousand) only. This may kindly be approved and the funds allotted accordingly.

Administrative Guide lines for Zonal Conference :

1. The purpose of such Conference is to help the members of different Regions to come closer to work in the spirit of Brother-hood and to strengthen the work of T.S. Regional Conference may be combined with Zonal Conference.
2. The Convener should fix the dates and venue in consultation with Regional Secretaries particularly of host Region to enable willing participants to plan their tour programme 3 months in advance.
3. The host Region should form a Sub-Committee for organising the Conference in befitting manner. Regional President and Secretary should be Ex-Officio Members of such Committee. Responsibility of printing, communication, reception, accommodation, transportation, food, arrangement of Meeting places may be delegated to suitable members.
4. Guest Speakers to be selected/contacted in time. Speeches should be short, provision should be made for interaction with TOS workers, business transaction, public lectures, retreat, TOS activities and entertainment programmes preferably presented by TOS sponsored children or beneficiaries.
5. Like minded members to be invited in public meetings so that they may be interested in TS/TOS and join the Society in future.
6. Attempt should be made to publish a souvenir and folders should be provided to the delegates, registration charges should be fixed within Rs.100-150/-, Rs.3000/- will be provided from the TOS India.

REGIONAL CONFERENCE GUIDELINES

1. The Region should organize Annual General Body Meeting and Annual Conferences within September every year with a chief guest as National Director/Secretary/National Committee member and a report to be sent to the Secretary, TOS India. If so desired the A G M and A C may be clubbed together.
2. Officers to the Region should be elected in the A G M after giving due notice to all good standing members after every three years. In case the Region fails to do so, the president of the region should suggest to the National Director the name of the person to be appointed as Regional Secretary to form a new Executive Committee for their Region.
3. The Annual report, and audited account of the Region along with the enclosures are to be sent to TOS India duly approved by the A G M.

The Theosophical Order of Service. **An Address by Dr. Annie Besant**

THE THEOSOPHICAL ORDER OF SERVICE was founded in order that a definite line of work be done on the ground of Brotherhood used in Service, and for that reason it requires a certain number of members to be connected with the T. S.

At one time, there was an inclination to confine the work of the T. S. to Theosophical Teachings. If we use the translation of the Greek word Theosophy, Divine Wisdom, there would be no danger of the T. S. being a sect.

The T. O. S. must leave the people free to show their brotherhood, to choose their own line of work. The term "Theosophical" Order of Service emphasizes the fact that the theory of brotherhood is embraced by its members, the same as tolerance and a willingness to accept all forms of Truth. "There is no Religion higher than Truth". The brotherhood of the T. S. is a nucleus of brotherhood. The O of S is intended to help us towards the realisation of Universal Brotherhood, not merely a brotherhood of the Elder Brothers, but with the criminal classes as well. Universal Brotherhood must not be a phrase, but a principle in life.

Is the first object of the T. S. in conflict with the second and third? If we talk of Universal Brotherhood, we ought to make no distinction as to who should be admitted to the Society. I should like to include in Universal Brotherhood, not only humanity, but all animals, even plants and minerals. We have a particular cell from which all the formative powers, strength and life go out. By treating a dog kindly, his mental growth quickens. A master said: "The heart of our Brotherhood is the unselfish service of mankind." That should be the aim of every member of the O. of S., should be an active force with which every member takes up some duty of a beneficent kind. A certain no-Theosophist, who is a keen worker, asked for a group in favour of vivisection to be formed in the O. of S. as a group for anti-vivisection already existed. I told her that, if she could show that torture of animals was consistent with brotherhood, I should agree. I never heard of the matter again.

Let us not fear to go among the lowest; for the purer the person, the more can he move in perfect safety, even among the most "Vile". When Shri Rama, the perfect king, was approached by a woman of bad reputation, he accepted the gift she offered and ate the fruit she had bitten into. And the Christ, when giving back health to the diseased, told them to "sin no more", to live the perfect life, the seed of which is in everyone and everything. There is only one Divine Life, and all life is part of Him. "Shall there be evil

in a city, the Lord hath done it." "If I go up into Heaven, Thou art there, if I go down into Hell, Thou art there also." Reverence the Divine Life in everything; recognize that good and evil are experiences. The more experiences we have, the better we evolve. A "mistake" as Mr. Ford once said, is but what adds to our knowledge. We should of right or wrong by the person who does it; thus we shall know whether it was done willfully or as a mistake. As imperfect beings, we cannot do perfect work, but we can realise that gaining an experience is the only way to progress.

Consider a discovery such as that of Galvani, the great investigator, who found the action of Galvanism through his observation of the moving frogs' leg hung on his balcony. Let his friends call him the "Frogs' dancing master"; he knew he had discovered a hitherto unknown law in nature. Thus our knowledge is ever increased. The Galvanometer, when put on the head of a person thinking hard, answers by swinging. By looking into the unknown we progress.

If we take Theosophical thought as the key in our studies, we realize that God exists everywhere, that He who is Supreme Goodness, is also Supreme Law. Our understanding increases with our learning: "Give me understanding and I shall keep your Law, yeh, I shall keep it with my whole heart."

Reincarnation is the key to the world. The more we study Theosophy the more will the puzzles of the world become clear.

In the O. of S. you have the key to an orderly life. Choose your activity carefully. In the morning make a plan of your day's work; use your thought power beneficially; make the habit (till it comes naturally) of snatching every opportunity to help and you will find thousands of things come in your way.

Do not get discouraged if your progress is but slow. I used to have a hasty temper, it took me years to get over it. I was helped by a lesson I got. I once saw a cartman striking the horse on the nose; I spoke to him heatedly and got a bad reply. Then I puzzled out that he was irritable only as I had been! I realized that in order to be truly useful, we must not stoop down, but must place ourselves beside those we want to help.

Try to bring into your Lodges people with whom you utterly disagree, and try to grasp their line of thought. The Law of Love, the only great law, will help you to understand the others; your knowledge will help you to bring the ignorant out of their ignorance and so to grow more quickly in evolution.

Theosophical Order of Service's enigmatic emblem reminds us to be fair and upright in our dealings with all concerned. We can explain it in the following manner.

The square indicates simple, fair and pure feelings towards all beings, or whom we are serving. This is clear from phrases like 'A Square Person', 'Square deal' etc. It represents equality (equal sides & angles).

In four corners there are four Lotuses, which remind us of universal brotherhood in all four corners of the earth. The Lotus indicates full blooming, that is "Nirvan" which is the highest aim of human life.

Though these flowers are rooted in mud and dirt, still they retain their purity, 'पुष्कर पलासवन निर्लेप' — (Lotus leaf, though in pond does not get wet). Like it we too may live in the world, doing 'निष्काम कर्म' (Selfless acts) despite being surrounded by selfishness. As lotus always faces the sun, selfless service too invokes God's blessing.

In the Center, the full blossomed rose indicates happiness and fulfillment, achieving the central aim of this service.

The emblem of TOS, full of flowers gives us the message of love, as flowers always do. They also represent selfless service (spreading fragrance all around). Thus emblem represents Truth, Beauty and Goodness. 'निष्काम सेवा' (Selfless service) being dedication to God is Satyam, 'The Truth', think of happiness of others is Shivam, (goodness), to serve with love is 'Sundaram' (the beauty) Flowers give us message of unfold ment towards higher life, and create an atmosphere of beauty. That means we must prepare ourselves for good actions without any form of discrimination. (To bloom into perfection) (Mrs. G.K. Ajeet, by courtesy "Seva Ki Triveni") "Flowers shed their fragrance upon all passer-by alike, not asking whether one appreciates that fragrance or not."
